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A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

When Blessed Fr. Basil Moreau, CSC, founded the Congregation of Holy Cross, he described his vision in this way, "Holy Cross will grow like a mighty tree and constantly shoot forth new limbs whose branches will produce yet others, and all nourished from the same sap and endowed with the same life."

We at Holy Cross High School in Flushing, Queens, New York are blessed to be guided by the vision of Blessed Fr. Basil Moreau, CSC.

As we celebrate our graduates of the class of 2018, we are preparing to welcome the class of 2022, the first class to include young women. Among the preparations are changes to campus facilities, professional development for faculty and staff, and a recognition of an infectious enthusiasm among constituents. And with great pride we send the class of 2018 to their next steps, nourished and endowed with what it means to be educated at Holy Cross.

During a Holy Cross Institute conference at St. Edward's University in early April, we learned of an impressive effort undertaken by our colleagues at one of the other seventeen CSC-sponsored high schools in the United States. Faculty, staff, administrators, parents and board members came together to use the writing of Blessed Fr. Basil Moreau, CSC, to define our shared vocation at Holy Cross. Two of Bl. Fr. Below is An Open Letter From The Catholic School Principals:

As the Principals of the Catholic High Schools of Brooklyn and Queens we have kept the administration, faculty, staff, students and parents from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in our prayers since the thoughtless tragedy on February 14, 2018. We stand in support of the Parkland, Florida survivors as they draw strength in knowing that their efforts to effect necessary change are heard. We call on our elected leaders to do everything necessary to help us protect students against senseless acts such as the one in Florida and too many others across our country.

The mission of Catholic education within the Diocese of Brooklyn is to form children in the knowledge and love of Jesus Christ as celebrated in the Catholic Church, while providing a comprehensive academic education that will help them reach their full human potential and contribute to the common good of our nation and the world. The alumni of our schools are leaders in every stratum of society, and our current students are the leaders and policy makers of tomorrow. We must stand as examples to them of the morality, justice and peace which we expect them to go forth and spread in the world. As Principals, we are responsible for carrying out the mission of our schools, the education of our students and the safety and security of the adolescents in our care. As educators we are facing a world where we are increasingly called upon to become the last line of defense against unspeakable horrors.



The Science Research Class has 12 students representing the sophomore, junior and senior classes. Each member of the research class works with an outside mentor at a science related facility. The students enrolled in the program worked at the following facilities: Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center, Brookhaven National Labs, New York Presbyterian Hospital/Queens, New York City Department of Environmental Protection, Alley Pond Park Environmental Center, New York University, AIM Medical Center, Chase Manhattan Bank Technology Department and the Rockefellar University.

Two of the young men are published authors of journal articles in their research field.


















CAMPUS MINISTRY



Our Campus Ministry office is dedicated to making God known, loved, and served through outreach to the HCHS community, and the community-at-large, through liturgies, prayer, services, retreats, and meaningful service.

Retreats

Director of Campus Ministry, Jack Rampulla, focused on establishing a spiritual well-being for the community through a retreat experience for all Freshman, Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors throughout the school year. With the help of Father Randy, they began taking steps to achieve this goal by retreats starting with our Sophomore class. Holy Cross High School's shared mission is to provide moral formation through retreats, a shared mission that insists we provide outlets for our students, faculty and staff, to search their inner selves to insure their spiritual well-being becomes a primary focus; i.e. ensuring we remain focused on Fr. Moreau's directive to all Holy Cross educators to educate the heart as well as the mind.

On April 17th and 18th One half of the Sophomore class on each day was taking on a one day retreat to the Immaculate Conception Center in Douglaston. The focus for the retreat is the Christian act of providing SERVICE. The agenda, completed by our director of Service Learning, Mr. Tsimoyianis, touched on Environment, Religion, Education, Healthcare, and Poverty. Mr. Michael Genovese, who over 45 years ago started the Service Learning Program here at Holy Cross; presented his insight. Faculty Michelle Garzon, Evan LaGreca, and Carrie Mulligan took active parts as group leaders for this retreat. Starting in September we will be conducting these retreats for all four years of students.

On April 24th-27th select Holy Cross students were invited to attend a Kairos Retreat, a spiritual experience that lasts a lifetime. Hosted by Bishop McNamara HS, one of our Holy Cross schools in Maryland, this year's Kairos event was a huge success. The boys, and their chaperones, Father Randy, Mr. Arens, Mr. Maher and Mr. Broschart, returned enriched, and feeling the Spirit which they assure will stay with them forever

The retreat invitation was accepted for two reasons. First, to give our students an experience they wouldn't soon forget by helping them to explore their relationship with God, and the retreat also served as a template for future Kairos events that we will sponsor starting in September, here at Holy Cross. The boys who attended will serve as next year's Kairos Retreat leadership team.

The students who attended, Anthony Evangelou, Anthony Rizzotto, Alex Loukopoulus, Angelo Vita, Sean Flynn, Michael Fuchs, Aidan Ryan, Andrew Papalardo, and Dean Bhuyan, explored such questions as, Who am I? Why am I here? How did I get here? Where am I in my relationship with God? This Kairos event also gave our students a chance to mingle with students from other Holy Cross schools, resulting in their coming back with fresh ideas, and a renewed spirit anchored in the mission of the Congregation of Holy Cross; to make God known, loved and served.

The boys and their chaperones returned Friday evening to a surprise reception; their parents waiting for them in our Holy Family Chapel, where they each took a moment to share their experience with all present. Their comments forced a collective beam to emanate from their audience; they made us all very proud.

SCREENAGERS

The Counseling Department viewed this documentary as a professional development opportunity and believed this information to be extremely beneficial for all professionals working with adolescents. For this reason a viewing of Screenagers was presented to all Holy Cross faculty on Friday, January 26th.


Screenagers has been shown in almost 5,000 venues including secondary schools, colleges and universities across the country and to over a million people. Physician and filmmaker, Delaney Ruston, conducted research and learned that the average child spends 6.5 hours a day looking at screens. She wondered about the impact of all this time and about the friction occurring in homes and schools around negotiating screen time.

SCREENAGERS probes into the vulnerable corners of family life and explores struggles over social media, video games, academics and internet addiction. Through poignant and unexpectedly funny stories, along with surprising insights from authors, psychologists, and brain scientists, SCREENAGERS reveals how tech time impacts children and young adults' development and offers solutions on how adults can empower them to best navigate the digital world and find balance.

We invited all current freshman, sophomores and incoming freshman with their parents to the screening of SCREENAGERS on Friday April 13th. In addition, we showed the Screenagers film to every freshman Theology class during the week of April 16th-20th.



NATIONAL COLLEGE DECISION DAY

The counselors received a lot of positive feedback from the faculty. This event provided an opportunity for the students to view their teachers on a more relatable level.

CYBER-BULLYING AND INTERNET SAFETY

Ms. Sharon Galvin also provided practical information on how to use the internet responsibly. She encouraged the students to be more aware of their use and its' impact on others.

EDUCATIONAL TRAVEL PROGRAM



This past spring break 20 students along with Mr. Kevin McRae, Mr. Evan LaGreca and Mr. Blaine Palmer had the opportunity to travel to Germany, Poland and the Czech Republic as part of the new Holy Cross Educational Travel Program. Students visited sites such as the Berlin Wall, Museum of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising and Auschwitz as they learned about the history of World War II first hand. "This was an extremely rewarding experience for our students. It

was an opportunity to grow in knowledge and understanding of both history and other cultures," said Mr. McRae, moderator of the program. "While many students probably spent their break playing video games or watching television, these young men had an experience they can take with them for a lifetime." The educational travel program already has full enrollment for next spring break's trip, when students will be traveling to Switzerland, Germany, Austria and Hungary.

CODING COMPETITION



On March 22nd, 2018, members of the Coding Club were presented with this year's task for the Annual Coding Competition. Our task was presented by Mrs. Bucciarelli who needed a way for students to sign up for the library online and also easy for her to store sign-up information. The competition was sponsored by Board Chair, Frank Orzo '64, a Holy Cross alum, who is a successful computer software developer and business owner of his own company, Orzo & Associates. Ms. Pirovolikos provided us

with the guidelines, the requirements from our programs and a deadline for the presentation of our projects on April 18th. The first place winner would receive \$100 while second place would win \$50. The participants of this year's competition were Kyle Burnett, Pythagore Charles, Andrew Henkel and Tanner Treasure.

The challenge was to create a computer program that would do the following: a Library sign-up form, a spreadsheet that stores student names, IDs, and preferred class periods, as well as an admin page to keep track of attendance. The program would cross reference a database of authorized library attendees and enable the user to store and print information.

Kyle and Pythagore worked in a team since they were new to coding. They presented a website that displayed a background design, a sign-up that had names, IDs and period numbers as required fields, and a timed page that would close after a certain amount of time. Tanner used HTML and PHP and ran the code he wrote in an online interpreter for testing the non-server related aspects of the program. Tanner's prototype was able to accept names, IDs and periods; the output was visible on an administrator page. Andrew programmed in Python, a popular and versatile programing language today, and utilized Flask web framework. His prototype was a sign-up form that required the school email, stored the information in an admin page and created an editable chart with period limits on students. It also showed which period was still available to the student. The most common display approach among the presented projects was HTML.

These programs didn't come without their own problems. For example, Tanner, Kyle, and Pythagore had issues getting a php page set up which would take the information submitted and make it available to Mrs. Bucciarelli on another page.

On April 18th each contestant presented their prototype to our honored judges: Mr. Orzo, Mrs.Bucciarelli and Mr. Arthur Louise. Andrew won \$100 for First Place. Tanner and the team of Pythagore and Kyle tied for Second Place. Each participant was encouraged to continue their efforts. Mr. Orzo advised the students on how they could market our programs. The Coding Club would like to thank Mr. Orzo, Ms. Pirovolikos, Mrs.Bucciarelli, Mr. Louise for the support and encouragement as we made our programs. The judges' guidance provided students insight on how real-world programming has to meet the criteria of human clients.



IN MEMORIAM

Brother Robert Joseph Brown, C.S.C. - February 14, 2018

Brother Robert Joseph Brown, C.S.C., a member of the Moreau Province, passed away on February 14, 2018 at Dujarie House, South Bend, IN. Born in Waterbury, CT on August 28, 1929, he was the fifth of eight children of Edward G. Brown and his wife, Roseline A. Caroline. Robert was baptized first on the day of his birth at St. Mary's Hospital and a year later at Saints Peter and Paul Church in Waterbury. He received his educational foundation in his hometown at St. Francis Xavier School and at Sacred Heart High School.

Upon graduating from high school in 1949, Robert attended Fairfield University for the academic year of 1949 - 1950. Desiring to enter religious life, he applied and, in September of 1950, was accepted into the Brothers of Holy Cross at St. Joseph Juniorate in Valatie, NY. He was received at St. Joseph Novitiate in Rolling Prairie, IN in February 1951, and made his first profession of vows on February 2, 1952. Brother Robert then went on to study at St. Edward's University in Austin, TX.

A call to serve in Holy Cross schools intervened before he was to finish his BA at St. Edward's University. Brother spent one year teaching at Holy Cross School, New Orleans and then five years at Notre Dame High School, West Haven, CT. The school year of 1958, he finished his undergraduate studies at St. Edward's University. Brother Robert went on to teach at Eastern Province schools in Warwick, RI, Flushing, NY and Waterbury, CT. He also participated in a one year Franciscan renewal program in Southern California.

While he was stationed at Holy Cross High School, Flushing, he established a Fine Arts Club that provided the opportunity for students and teachers from the school to enjoy art events of the Big Apple: plays and musicals on Broadway, operas and symphony concerts at Lincoln Center, and visits to the New York Museum of Art. Brother Robert also established a student retreat program, taking students from the high school for a four - day experience on Shelter Island at the end of Long Island. To this day, graduates speak highly of having such experiences.

When he left the classroom, in 1991 to 2012, Br. Robert lived with Holy Cross communities, first at Hughes Avenue and then at Lorillard Place, both in the Bronx. He volunteered in various church-related service programs, and during those years enjoyed the cultural events of New York City, especially the opera.

In December of 2012, Brother was diagnosed with cancer and received chemotherapy while living at St. Joseph Center in Valatie, NY. In March of 2015, with continued failing health, Br. Robert moved to Schubert Villa, an assisted living health care facility at Holy Cross Village, Notre Dame, IN. He later received the medical support and hospice care he needed by moving to Dujarie House at the Holy Cross Village. He passed on to new life with hospice care staff at his side.


ALUMNI REUNION
