

CATHERINE KENNY, MPH

Chairperson, Science Department Holy Cross High School

"I love teaching at Holy Gross and truly believe it is a calling and this is where I am supposed to be."



Cathy Kenny and her sister Barbara grew up in Jackson Heights with their parents, Catherine, an Administrative Assistant at Estee Lauder and Peter, a Vice President of Emigrant Savings Bank. Cathy and Barbara attended Our Lady of Fatima grammar school before enrolling at St. Agnes High School in College Point.

Cathy's own Catholic upbringing was intrinsic in her decision to teach in the private sector. After graduating from The College of Mount St. Vincent she worked per diem at St. Luke's grammar school and St. Agnes High School before interviewing with Brother Karl Diemand in 1985 and accepting a faculty position as a Science teacher at Holy Cross High School. Cathy has



never regretted her decision and has contributed to the prestige and growth of the school's Science Department with the establishment of the Science Research Program in 2006.

When diagnosed with breast cancer - and fortunate to have it detected early enough to be a survivor - Cathy thought about what she could do to turn it into a positive teaching experience and raise awareness of the disease. She learned of a program affiliated with the State University at Albany wherein students work with mentors – some of them Holy Cross alumni - on independent research projects, beginning at the end of their freshman year. They learn to network and interact with others, both at the school and off-site at

prestigious facilities such as Sloan Kettering and Columbia Medical Center. All of her students have gone to college on scholarship and some have accepted positions at the organizations where they conducted their research. One of her students,

Domenick Kamel '11 worked on a case study that was presented at the American Cardiac Conference in New Orleans. Another student, Malcolm Harris '12, worked with a professor at John Jay College on a research project that focused on ballistics and is now used in the courts. Robert Scagnelli '11, who is currently in his last year of medical school said, "Mrs. Kenny is the reason I decided to go into medicine. Through her



mentorship in the science research program and the constant love, support and inspiration she gave me throughout



the college applications process, I have no doubt that I truly would not be where I am today if it were not for her."

Another program Cathy founded at Holy Cross is "Real Knights Wear Pink" which raises money for breast cancer research. Students are in charge of selling t-shirts and bracelets and have raised more than \$20,000 for Sloan Kettering over 10 years. She has also been a moderator in the annual Blood Drive and was one of the internal coordinators for Middle States Accreditation. In 2015 Cathy was named Chairperson of the Science Department.

Cathy met her husband, James (retired from Sony Music), when she was at Mount St. Vincent and he was down the road at Manhattan College. They reside in Whitestone and will be celebrating their 40th anniversary in 2020 with a trip to Greece. Cathy and Jim are very proud of their two sone. Beter

Jim are very proud of their two sons, Peter

and Daniel. Peter graduated from Holy Cross in 1999. He was Man of the Year, Valedictorian, and President of the National Honor Society and resides in Bedford, NY with his wife, Michelle, and their children Charlotte Lucia, Jackson Peter and Everett Francis. Daniel, who graduated from Regis High School in 2006, attended Boston College and currently resides in Washington, D.C.

After 39 years of teaching, Cathy often crosses paths with former students and their families. It is a constant reminder that she is part of the very special Holy Cross family and community, all striving for the same goals. Of her induction into the Hall of Fame, Cathy remarks, "I love teaching at Holy Cross and truly believe it is a calling and this is where I am supposed to be."

JAMES P. MALONE '70

School Counselor and Coach Garden City High School Coach, Beach Channel High School

im Malone grew up in Richmond Hill with his brother Tom '72 and sister, Ellen, children of hardworking parents of Irish/German descent – Eileen and Jim. Jim was attending Our Lady of Cenacle grammar school when he heard about Holy Cross from a friend, Kevin Raftery, whose brothers attended the school. Although small in stature at the time, Jim went out for the freshman basketball team. "I grew nine inches from junior year to freshman year of college," he remarked. He developed a strong connection to Coaches Bill O'Meara and Jim Kerr and Brother James Kane. The biggest influence at Holy Cross came from Brother Carl Winters, Director of Guidance. "He came across to me as very helpful to many of the kids and I thought, 'what a wonderful way to go through life'." Although he did not know it at the time, all of these gentlemen would have a profound impact on Jim's career choices.

It was serendipity that led Jim to begin his career at Holy Cross. After graduating from SUNY Stony



Brook with a BA in Sociology, Brother Carl encouraged Jim to pursue his Masters at Hofstra and intern for a year at Holy Cross, so that he could apply for a Guidance position when he left. Jim was hired in 1979 and for eight years enjoyed working at Holy Cross as a counselor and freshman and JV basketball coach where he developed strong ties with students and their families. He was also involved in Peer Counseling and the SAT program. "It was a wonderful time to work there....a lot of camaraderie and school spirit," Jim shared. He later assumed coaching positions at St. Francis College and Beach Channel High School.



Jim first met his wife, Diane, at a dance when they were 14 years old. When they began raising their family of four – Terence, Daphne, Jamie and

Paige - he joined the public school system starting at Lawrence High School and ending at Garden City High School where he currently serves as a guidance counselor and golf coach. After 40 years, Jim still finds working with students as a counselor rewarding and fulfilling. "It is important to me because it shows the

kids that there is someone watching them grow and develop who cares about what happens to them." He is also able to apply those skills and knowledge of the college application process as varsity basketball coach at Beach Channel. His achievements as a coach include Beach Channel Queens Champs 2003; Garden City Boys Golf Team Long Island Champs 2003 and Nassau County Champs 2002, 2003 and 2008. Jim was also awarded Newsday's PSAL Coach of the Year in 1992. "Jim was one of my all-time greatest assistant coaches," Coach Kerr recalls. "He was great with the kids and everyone loved him. He was very dedicated to coaching and the kids which is why he is so successful."

In 2010, Jim and Diane lost their daughters Jamie and Paige in a tragic auto accident that impacted their entire community. To honor the girls' memory, the Malone family established a foun-




dation that supports many local charities. Residents of Floral Park, they count many friends among the alumni and former faculty in the area and enjoy spending summers in Montauk. Their daughter Daphne and their son-in-law Pete have blessed them with their first grandchild, Patrick, and another is on the way. Their son Terence is a Director at Barclay's and enjoys living in NYC near his girlfriend Lisa. For Jim, who loved Holy Cross tremendously, being inducted in the Hall of Fame is an honor which he looks forward to celebrating with family and friends.

Gill McDermott grew up in Elmont, New York with his brother Kevin McDermott, Esq. '69, sister novelist Alice McDermott and parents Mildred and Bill Sr., both products of a devout Catholic upbringing. After graduating from St. Boniface, Bill, along with many kids from Elmont grammar schools, chose to attend high school at Holy Cross – his number one choice. Mirroring his parents' work ethic, Bill held after school jobs which, regretfully, precluded him from participating in school sports and other activities. "I had a paper route for Newsday, then went to work at a supermarket after school," he reminisces, "but once I had a car I was able to get involved with the school newspaper."

He did, however, excel in Math and English which would have a tremendous impact on his future career. He recalls with clarity the excellent teachers who laid the foundation for the rest of his education: Brothers Robert McMahon, Francis Ellis and Gerald Kenney, Mr. Robert Larkin and Mr. Roger Buckley. He credits Brother Kenney and Mr. Buckley for the valuable lessons he learned about structure and note taking. "You can see from the email exchanges between classmates how well we were taught



to write," Bill observed.

After graduation, Bill spent two years at Queens College in pre-engineering, then transferred to the State University of New York at Buffalo to complete his B.S. in Civil Engineering, still unsure as to his direction. One of his professors encouraged him to apply to their law school to broaden his career opportunities and he earned his J.D. in 1975. "During my first year of law school I attended classes in the morning, worked part-time in an engineering job in the afternoon, then went home and read law books," Bill recalls.



But this foresight prepared Bill for an opportunity at Sevenson Environmental Services (best known for their role in the Love Canal cleanup) as in-house Counsel in 1975, and where he currently serves as CFO and General Counsel. He helped take the company public in 1989, then private again in 2002 as the firm transitioned from a general building contractor to an environmental remediation company. He has been a founding partner, officer and director of several other businesses that have since been sold or merged and holds leadership positions in several area organizations including the Canisius College Board of Regents, Niagara Frontier Corporate Counsel Association, Niagara County Business Association and Mathewson-McCarthy Babe Ruth Baseball League. He also was a lecturer at the State University of New York at Buffalo, Department of Civil Engineering.



Bill and his wife of 37 years, Jo-Ann, whom he met at the University as resident advisors, reside in Williamsville, New York and have two sons, Ryan and Steven. Ryan is an Attending Physician of Emergency Medicine in Scottsdale, Arizona. Steven, who followed in his dad's footsteps majoring in engineering and now attending law school lives nearby with his wife, Ariana. Bill and Jo-Ann love to travel and because of technology today he can work on the road.

Surprised and honored by his induction, Bill says that although he is geographically far away, Holy Cross is always in the forefront of his mind and is delighted that he is now in contact with his former classmates on social media. He very much enjoyed getting reacquainted with everyone who attended their recent 50th Anniversary class reunion. "I think I owe Holy Cross a lot more than it owes me. Holy Cross giving me this honor is unexpected and I couldn't be more pleased."

ne of four offspring born to Italian immigrants Guilio and Nancy who met at Queens College, Armando Petruccelli learned early on that family, faith, a good education and strong work ethic were the keys to a successful life.

Growing up in Flushing, Armando attended St. Kevin's grammar school with his siblings Joseph '00, Teresa and Filippa. When it came time to choose a high school, Armando selected Holy Cross where there was always a member of the extended

and Joe Giannuzzi, the Dean of Students at the time, were major positive influences in Armando's life and future.






Holy Cross to share his life experience with students at Career Day. Armando credits his professional and personal success to the foundation he received at Holy Cross and makes a profound

Jimmy was an average student, second honors, who participated in sports and the Fine Arts Club. He was a runner at Holy Cross, and served as Captain of the Cross Country team his junior and senior years. During Jimmy's time at Holy Cross the individuals who most impacted his life included Coach Bill O'Meara, Joe Giannuzzi '65 and his Holy Cross guidance counselor and fellow honoree, Jim Malone '70, with whom he maintains a friend-ship to this day. Jim Malone was very influential to Jimmy. "I had a lot going on at home and he helped me with that." He also encouraged Jimmy to be a peer counselor.

ick Reichenbach was born in Flushing and attended Holy Family in Flushing with his sisters Jean and Patti. His parents Bob and Peggy were strong supporters of Catholic education and wanted the values they revered to be passed on to their children.

Admittedly not a stellar student, it wasn't until junior year that Rick began to appreciate and enjoy his time at Holy Cross. As his attitude improved, so did his grades. In retrospect, Rick says, "Holy Cross gave me the work ethic I was going to need for the rest of my life." There were also a number of faculty members who encouraged and never gave up on him including Brother Frank Ellis and Robert Larkin, who Rick still reverse to this day. Steve thanks Coach Tom Pugh for his pivotal impact on his career path. "When I first met Steve I knew right away he would be successful," Pugh recalls. "He had self-confidence and grit, so that even when he was out of his comfort zone, he was able to handle any situation in a mature manner."

GERARD "ROD" O'CONNELL '61



(Posthumous)

"Those who knew Rod knew he was selfless and generous to a fault. – John Douglas 61



od, or Roddy, O'Connell was born and raised in Douglaston, New York, where he lived in the same house on Prospect Avenue for 69 years until his passing in 2014. There was no member of the community more active and hands on than Rod, so much so that they dubbed him the "Unofficial Mayor of Douglaston."

In the summer of 1957, just after Rod graduated from St. Anastasia and was getting ready to enter Holy Cross High School, his father died suddenly. Rod's lifelong friend and classmate John Douglas '61 recalls that Mrs. O'Connell received much needed help from Holy Cross to ensure her son would continue his education at the school which opened only two years earlier as the first boy's Catholic high school in Queens.



With a gregarious personality, even as a young man, Rod enjoyed his time at Holy Cross. His interests were vast and he was a member of the Biology and Aeronautics Clubs and served as an usher and on the Dance Committee. He also played cymbals in the Holy

Cross band all four years under the directorship of Brother Renatus Foldenauer, C.S.C. and was especially fond of his Science teacher, Richard "Doc" Schiliro.

After graduating from Villanova, Rod worked for the Practical Nurses

Association in New York and began a career in the real estate business in Little Neck and Douglaston. He eventually became a partner, then sole owner, of Bryce Rea Realty. As his real estate business thrived, Rod turned his attention to helping wherever he was needed. He was an active member of the Community Church of Douglaston Theater, the

Douglaston-Little Neck Lions Club and the Douglaston Civic Association. Rod was also instrumental in the popularity and growth of the Little Neck Douglaston Memorial Day Parade, one of the largest parades in the country, and volunteered with the Visiting Nurses.

Rod's interests were broad – he traveled all over Europe, Egypt, Ibiza, the Greek Islands, Russia, and would regale friends with his repetition of a somewhat disastrous trek in the Himalayas, when he emerged from a murky swamp covered head to toe with leeches. And his love of the arts – theater, opera, every genre of music – led him to have a very "social" life in Manhattan, attending galas and balls, his tuxedo always at the ready!

Back at Holy Cross High School, whenever there was

a class reunion Rod was often the first to arrive and the last to depart – as long as the music played. His friend Bill Burke '61 recollected that a number of his classmates mentioned their wives were hobbling around the day after an event due to Rod's energetic love of dancing with all the ladies. He also supported the school's Hall of Fame Dinner, Golf Classic and Spring Raffle.

Rod also involved himself, very quietly, in helping others. He had a generosity of spirit that saw no bounds – not just supportive and emotional, but very concrete and tangible, from the many teenage guys and girls he helped on a rocky path to



adulthood, to numerous others he supported through emotional difficulties, lost loves, or financial hardships – always focusing on the beauty of life.

During his last visit with Rod in the hospice, John informed him he would be establishing the Rod O'Connell Scholarship Fund at Holy Cross High School to provide financial aid to students and their families - with preference given to members of the band. For his devotion to Holy Cross High School and the community-at-large we are honored to present the Holy Cross High School Cross and Anchor Award, posthumously, to Rod O'Connell, Class of 1961.

ANGELO COZZA '83

(Posthumous)

ngelo Cozza was born in Brooklyn and raised in Ozone Park along with his three siblings, Elizabeth, Joseph and Juliana. Sadly, his dad Louis passed away when Angelo was only 9 months old. Nevertheless, his mother Audrey made sure her

children received a Catholic education which began at St. Sylvester's grammar school. When it came time to choose a high school, Angelo was determined to attend Holy Cross despite the inconvenient commute on public transportation from southwestern Queens.



Angelo went out for football as a freshman and played all four years at Holy Cross. He soon became a "superstar," admired by his teammates not only for his ball handling but for his leadership skills. "I loved that kid," says Coach Tom Pugh. "He was a great player, one of the leaders on the team. He led by example and never asked anyone to do anything he wouldn't do."



After graduation, Angelo went away to school on scholarship but returned soon after and attended New York Tech to be closer to home. He worked in Finance for a brief period before being called by the New York City Fire Department where he spent most of his time at Ladder 146 in Williamsburg, Brooklyn.

Shortly prior to that, in 1990, Angelo met his wife, Joann at a club in New York City which she visited with her brother, Joseph Baratta '84. "My brother actually chaperoned our first date," she joked. "They had not seen each other since high school and quickly rekindled their relationship."

When Angelo married Joann in 1992 he became a dad to her son, Philip, and daughter, Tara, and soon became the coach for their baseball and softball teams. Their family grew to include daughters Michelle, Jena and Angela and the Cozza family made their home in Levittown on Long Island. Angelo was an amazing person, Joann recalls fondly. "He was the life of every party....he had more video time than the bride and groom at weddings." Angelo also belonged to the Holy Name Society, Knights of Columbus and was a CYO coach and referee.



Angelo passed away from prostate cancer at the age of 36 on August 2, 2001, a month prior to 9/11. Joann reflects that perhaps Angelo "was needed up there to greet all of the guys who died that day." Joann shared that while

he was in the hospital Angelo had many visits from former coaches, colleagues and friends. When a group of NYC firefighters trekked to Indianapolis to play a basketball tournament in the 2001 World Police and Fire Games and Angelo was unable to make the trip, they played in his honor. Every day they kept him updated on their results and eventually brought home the gold in spite of the odds not being in their favor. The team visited him in the hospital to present him with his

medal upon their return. "The fire department was like a second family," Joann said. They continued to pay tribute to Angelo through annual

football tournaments and dinner dances. And to honor his love of all things Holy Cross, the Cozza family established a scholarship award in Angelo's name at the school.

In recognition of his inspiration to everyone whose lives he touched, tonight we are proud to present the St. Brother André Medal, posthumously, to Angelo Cozza, Class of 1983.

TASO PAPPAS '89

(Posthumous)

"As an athlete he took your breath away" – John Knesich '89



t the age of five, Anastasios (Taso) Pappas was introduced to the game of soccer and instantaneously became devoted to the sport. "From that very moment, Taso was rarely seen without a soccer ball in his hands or at his feet," said his friend and teammate, John Knesich '89.

Growing up in Jamaica, then Whitestone, with his brother George and sister Mina, Taso was a source of pride for his parents



Steve, a carpenter, and Barbara, a homemaker. When he wasn't volunteering at his Holy Cross Greek Orthodox Church Sunday School, he was playing soccer for St. Mel's CYO, the Blue Angeles Istria Club, Westchester United and the Pancyprian and Olympiakos teams. But it was always his dream for years to play on Holy Cross High School's soccer team.

During his four years at Holy Cross Taso realized his dream. In senior year he was voted Most Valuable Player of the Catholic High School Soccer League. Not only did Taso excel at Soccer, he was equally as successful with regard to his academics. He had a unique ability to excel at anything



he set his mind to and worked hard for the grades he needed to apply to some of the most prestigious schools, hoping to continue his passion for the game throughout his college career.

His hard work paid off and in senior year Taso was offered a full scholarship to Fordham University to play for the Division I Rams and his future looked bright.

On Taso's 18th birthday, April 24, 1989, he was on the way home from school when he was involved in an automobile accident which sadly took his life and extinguished his dreams. His sudden and untimely death was a crushing loss to his family and friends and the entire Holy Cross community.

According to John, Taso was an exceptional young man who exuded warmth, generosity and had an infectious personality. "As a person, he had a mesmerizing charm and people were always drawn to him. As an athlete, he took your breath away."

John recalled times when, following a game, the team would go out to eat and Taso would ask his father for money - not only for himself but for his teammates who could not afford it. His sister Mina recalls how he loved showering his parents and siblings with gifts. "Every holiday from Valentine's to birthdays he would buy them gifts just to make them happy and see the smiles on their faces. He was simply a remarkable young man that blessed those who knew him."



To keep the memory of his generous and caring nature alive, the Pappas family established the Taso Pappas Memorial Scholarship at Holy Cross High School. Over the years the award has been presented to deserving Holy Cross

> students. In the image of Taso's achievements, the honored recipient was chosen based on their soccer and academic abilities. "This scholarship has been a wonderful way to keep Taso's

memory alive, said his brother, George. "It has truly honored his life and love of soccer."
