Nearly 200 years ago, when Blessed Fr. Basil Moreau, CSC, the founder of the Congregation of Holy Cross, pondered an inspirational symbol and motto for his young congregation, it was certain to include the Cross. It was, after all, taken from the name of the neighborhood in Le Mans, France where his work began: Sainte Croix, or Holy Cross.

CARLO ACQUISTA '96

Head Coach, Men's Soccer, Fordham University

"I will always be grateful for the love and care I received at Holy Cross."



he Acquista family is renowned in the Queens community for their soccer achievements, from patriarch Rosario, to the youngest brother of five. No one in the family has achieved more success on "il campo di calcio" than Carlo '96, who is Head Coach of the Men's Soccer team at Fordham University.

Carlo was raised in Whitestone, Queens, by restauranteurs Rosario and Maria ("mama Tiramisu"), who emigrated from Sicily as teenagers in 1968. Even as newborns, Carlo and his siblings – Guiseppe, Alessandro '01, Paolo '01 and Fabio '06 – woke up each day next to a soccer ball placed in their crib. Devout Catholics, the boys attended St. Mel's grammar school to reinforce the discipline, values and education they received at home. Although his older brother was attending St. Francis Prep, the up-and-coming soccer program at Holy Cross attracted Carlo's attention. He wanted to play with the best athletes, among them

Armando Petruccelli and Jimmy Buscemi, who were already making their mark.

At Holy Cross, Carlo found his second home. His soccer coach, Paul Gilvary, taught him and his teammates the "Holy Cross Way," and they loved being a part of it. "Gil was an educator, leader and role model, who was always there for us," he recalls. "Joe G was also phenomenal, and kept everything together outside of sports. Both of them treated us like their own sons." He recalls a day when a few of the players did not show up for practice. On the way to the field, they diverged from their normal bus route to find the group on Francis Lewis Boulevard by Prep. "They turned white when the bus pulled up. That is just one example of how they taught us lessons, helped us grow, and kept an eye on us to ensure we stayed on course."

When it came time to choose a college, Carlo was recruited by several schools, but knew he wanted to stay in New York. He chose to attend St. John's University on a full ride, where he majored in Sports Management. He was a four-year member of the Red Storm men's soccer team and helped St. John's capture an NCAA Division I national title in 1996, and also had a hand in two Big East Championship teams. In 2002, Coach Gil received a call from the Athletic Director at St. Francis College, who mentioned they were looking for a soccer coach. "He never called anyone, but he reached out and told me I would be crazy if I didn't go for it," Carlo recalls. He was at St. Francis for five years, during which time he had his strongest season in 2004, guiding the Terriers to an 8-9-1 record and a fifth-place finish in the Northeast Conference. While attending Adelphi University for his Masters, Carlo was attracted to its suburban location, and when they called to offer him a coaching position, he jumped at the opportunity.





Carlo had a stellar career over 11 seasons at Adelphi. He posted a 120-69-19 record with the Panthers and led them to four league championships, including two in the Atlantic Soccer Conference and Northeast-10 Conference, earning Northeast-10 and ECAC Coach of the Year honors in both of those seasons. In 2016, Adelphi went 19-1-2, winning the NCAA Division II East Region and advancing to the NCAA Championship quarterfinals, setting school record for wins and shutouts, and finishing the year ranked fifth in the United Soccer Coaches national poll. He was named the 2016 United Soccer Coaches East Region Coach of the Year, as Adelphi finished with a #5 national ranking. In his first six years at the helm, he oversaw the final Division I seasons for the team in the Atlantic Soccer Conference and as an independent. In that time, the squad claimed two ASC Tournament titles, while reaching the playoffs all five years. Carlo was honored as the ASC Coach of the Year three times.

In 2018, after one year as a New York Red Bulls scout and recruiter, Carlo made another move that would catapult his career. As fate would have it, he ran into Coach Gil on the Fordham campus after they contacted Carlo about a head soccer coach position that was open. "He was in the gym, talking to their facilities director about the upcoming basketball playoffs. I knew when I left the meeting that I would be offered the job," he says.

In just two short seasons as head coach at Rose Hill, the Rams qualified for the Atlantic 10 Championship both seasons, and in year two, after an unbeaten regular season, Fordham won the Atlantic 10 Championship title and progressed to the 2nd round of the NCAA tournament, losing to the eventual National Champions, Marshall University. Following the season, Carlo was selected by his Fordham peers for the 2020-2021 Iron Major Award, as Fordham Coach of the Year.

Carlo spends as much time as possible now raising his family in Westbury, Long Island, with his wife, Lauren, who he met at Adelphi. They have been blessed with three boys: 4-year-old twins Lucas and Christian, and Leo, who was born in June. Aside from coaching his own sons, Carlo owns a company, One Goal Sport, that provides trainers to soccer clubs. They are also volunteers and fundraisers for their favorite charity, the Ronald McDonald House. Carlo is a member of the United States Soccer Federation and the United Soccer Coaches organization, and serves on the advisory board for the Long Island Junior Soccer League. His goal for the future is to be the best version of himself that he can be, and to continue making a living in the sport



he loves. Carlo will always be a part of Holy Cross' storied soccer history, and will be forever grateful for the love and care he received in return.

s exemplary as Richard Duggan's track record was at Holy Cross, it is the outpouring of support for his Hall of Fame nomination – from his family, classmates and individuals whose lives he impacted since graduation – that sets Rich apart from the ordinary.

Born on the Feast Day of St. Joseph, the patron saint of Holy Cross High School, it seemed destined that Rich would wind up at the school "down the block" from where he grew up with his parents Theresa and Richard, sister Barbara and brother John '73. From childhood, mom and dad drilled into them the importance of school. They began their education at St. Mary's Grammar School, staffed by the Sisters of St. Joseph. Rich recalls that in the 8th grade, the school day was extended by an hour. Rich credits his Dad for his model work ethic. After being discharged from WWII at 28 with diabetes, Mr. Duggan was told he would go blind by the age of 50. Instead, he worked every day until he lost his sight at 60, without a complaint. "We did not know we were poor growing up," Rich says. "We were actually so wealthy from the love and support of our family."

Rich chose to attend Holy Cross after watching it being built. He felt like a part of the process, and it was the only high school that he wanted to go to. It had no history yet. He tried out for football, basketball, baseball – until he found his niche on the Cross Country and Track teams. With the encouragement of Brother Walter Foley, Rich quickly gained the respect of upperclassmen Marty Ferko, Rich Fennelly and John Douglas, the team's top three. "I just wanted to keep up with this group," he confides.

As a 15-year-old junior in 1960, Rich helped the team finish second at the St. John's Invitational, 2nd in the sectionals, 1st in the CHSAA Championship and 1st in the Eastern States. He won a medal in every race at Van Cortlandt and was the individual Champion senior year in the St. John's Invitational. His times at Van Cortlandt Park still rank in the top 5 for Holy Cross runners. By early March of 1961 they competed in





the Nationals at Madison Square Garden in the 2 Mile Relay, broke the existing National Record and finished 4th. By late March they began the outdoor season at the Archbishop Molloy 4 Mile Relay. Rich led off with a 4:33 mile time. He had the 2nd fastest split of the day. Holy Cross recorded three of the top 4 individual times of the meet, posting a time of 18:16 to break the meet record. It was ranked 5th in the nation. At the Queens-Iona Relays, Rich led off the 2 Mile Relay and Distance Medley, giving Holy Cross the lead in each race. In 1961, the Knights established themselves as one of the top quartets in the nation, with times of 7:54.6 and 10:24.6. At the Penn Relays, Rich led off the winning 2 Mile Relay and the second place


Distance Medley.

Rich attended Providence College after graduation, and subsequently earned his Masters of Education at Rhode Island College. He began his teaching/coaching career at Our Lady of Providence High School Seminary, and then spent the next 25 years teaching Math and coaching Cross Country, Indoor and Outdoor Track at Mount Pleasant High School. It was here that Rich reaped the greatest rewards. He invested not only his time and talent in many student-athletes, but

advocated for them to work and train harder to become successful. He implemented a breakfast program before the Federal government mandated one, and visited the Projects to teach Math to students that were not in school for a variety of reasons.







morning to pick up students on the 45-minute drive to school so they could do an early morning workout. Often, I did not return home until my own children were already in bed." Rather than regret his absence, Rich's children laud their father for his selflessness, and make up for lost time by getting together often.

There is no doubt that Rich's dad and mom, who passed in 1984 and 2014, would be very proud of how their children lived out the values they instilled in them early on. Sadly, Rich's brother John, who joined the FDNY after graduating from Bridgeport University, died at the age of 39 from injuries sustained in the line of duty. His sister Barbara, who attended Adelphi University, is still at work today for the Visiting Nurse Service of New York.

About his induction into the Holy Cross High School Hall of Fame, Rich remarks, "It is such a great honor. So many people were there for me at Holy Cross to help me grow and go on to the next step."







JAMES P. MAGEE '71

immy Magee's curriculum vitae includes a litany of personal and professional accomplishments, from an NFL tryout with the Denver Broncos to founding the first inter-dealer broker (IDB) in the Canadian government bond market. He has served on numerous boards and counts among his many awards, recognition of his athletic skill as a member of the Villanova University Hall of Fame (Football), and his leadership example as the "Catholic Business Person of the Year" (2008) in Toronto, Canada. It is readily apparent that he has achieved a successful work-life balance grounded on faith and family.

Jimmy was born into an Irish Catholic family, the oldest of four brothers, and eight sisters. His parents, Patrick and Mary Magee, relocated the young family from an Irish enclave in the Bronx (138th and Cypress Ave) to Manhasset, Long Island. Jimmy attended school in Manhasset until high school, when his parents decided he might fare better under the guidance of the Holy Cross Brothers in Flushing, NY.

Holy Cross also presented the opportunity to play football. It was on the gridiron that Jimmy excelled as a defensive end, under the leadership of Coach Bill O'Meara and Brother Francis Ellis (who was also Dean of Discipline) freshman year, then finished out his three years on the varsity team with Coaches Gerald Lehaney and James Pizzani, earning NYCHSAA All-Star recognition. Rounding out his high school education, Brother Etienne Cooper instilled in him an appreciation for music and art, and Jimmy enjoyed the Fine Arts Club visits to the theatre, opera and other cultural institutions around New York City.



Recruited by a number of universities, Jimmy took his dad's and grandfather's advice to attend Villanova on a football scholarship, where he majored in Liberal Arts. After graduation, he was invited to the Denver Bronco Football Club training camp for the 1976 team, and was also invited to the Philadelphia Eagles training camp.



In 1977, Jimmy was employed on Wall Street by the government bond firm Carroll McEntee and McGinley, when he was transferred to Toronto for what was to be a two-year stint. He found his niche there, and the job turned into a career. By 1979, Jimmy was given a leadership opportunity as President of Shorcan Brokers Limited, the first inter-dealer broker in the Canadian fixed income market. Under his management, the company expanded broker service to derivatives (IRS), opened Canadian IDB service in New York and London, England, improved transparency, trading rules and settlement procedures, and introduced electronic trading for the Canadian bond and money markets. As CEO, Jimmy managed the purchase and sale of the business on three occasions.

During the period that Shorcan was owned by international money broker Exco PLC (1986-1998), he served on their Board and Executive Committee while they transitioned from a large private money broker with 2,500 global employees to the first publicly traded money broker when it was listed on the London stock exchange in 1994.

He retired from Shorcan/TSX in 2008, and proceeded to hike the Camino de Santiago (Walk of St. James), 500 miles over 30 days in Spain. He has dedicated his time and talent to numerous boards, many of which were Catholic values-based, and even picked up a hobby/job selling baseball programs for the Spring Training season of the Cardinals and Marlins in Jupiter, Florida. He also enjoys cycling and has covered 600 miles on a trek from Toronto, Canada to Southampton, NY.

Jimmy met his wife and former client, Winnie, in Canada where they settled in Toronto to raise their five children: Kathleen, Patrick, Mary Catherine, Seanna, and Thomas. All of the Magee children attended Catholic high school, and all but Kathleen attended Catholic universities: Kathleen graduated from the University of Pennsylvania; Patrick and Thomas continued their dad's legacy at Villanova; Mary Catherine attended Notre Dame; and Seanna attended St. Frances Xavier (Nova Scotia). He is very proud of all of them – and despite being separated across the United States and Canada – they get together often, along with their seven grandchildren under age seven, whenever possible!

Among the awards Jimmy has received are the Villanova Alumni Medal from the College of Arts and Science; Meritus (Toronto) Catholic Business Person of the Year and Villanova Loyalty Award. He was also inducted into Villanova's athletic Hall of Fame in 1999.



Jimmy's professional designations (retired) include Certified Management Accountant (CMA) and a Professional Director (ICD.D) from the University of Toronto's Rotman School of Business and the Institute for Corporate Directors. He has a Bachelor of Arts (Villanova, 1975) and a Master of Business Administration (Queens University, Kingston, Ontario, 2002).





RICHARD W. SCHNEIDER '64

Chairperson, Business Department Holy Cross High School (1968-2008)

ithout a doubt, family is the most prevalent theme throughout Richard Schneider's life. From the 61 years he spent attending, teaching, coaching and volunteering with his Holy Cross family, to enjoying the blended clan of six children and 10 grandchildren he shares with his wife, Patty, Rick is living "la dolce vita" and could not be happier in his golden years.

His lifelong saga with Holy Cross began before the school was even built. The second son of Maurice, a purchasing agent for American Tobacco Company, and Agnes, a secretary, Rick was born in Brooklyn and raised in Queens Village. Concerned about the lack of Catholic high schools in Queens, his mom attended a luncheon fundraiser hosted by the Holy Cross Brothers. Their goal was to build the first Catholic high school in Queens. His brother, Chris '61, led the way for Rick who entered Holy Cross in 1960, and shortly thereafter formed bonds with Coaches Dan Dwyer and Bill O'Meara, and Brother Francis Elllis, who would influence Rick as a student-athlete, and later on as fellow members of the Holy Cross faculty. Rick played Freshman, JV and Varsity basketball for Coach O'Meara, and served on the Student Council. He counted among his friends, Holy Cross teammates Harry Groom, Jackie Wilson, John Raftery and Rich Goggin. He vividly recalls senior year, when they were eliminated in playoffs by Power Memorial, whose rising star at center was Lew Alcindor (Kareem Abdul Jabar). "If we were going to lose, we lost to the best," Rick says.

When it came time to choose a college, Rick had only two requirements: It had to be away from home and he would have the opportunity to play college basketball; his parents stipulated it had to be Catholic. At Marist, he played basketball all four years. He was Captain of the Freshman basketball team, played 3 years of Varsity, and was Captain senior year. A big influencer at Marist was former Newsday and Long Island Press columnist, Ed Lowe, who graduated a year ahead of him.

In 1968, immediately upon graduating from Marist, Rick began teaching history at Holy Cross High School. Contemplating a more lucrative career path, Rick attended graduate school at Long Island University, where he earned his MBA, with plans to enter the corporate world. However, he did not bank on finding a career that offered more meaningful rewards.





Rick fell in love with coaching basketball at Holy Cross, alongside mentors Bill O'Meara, Jim Kerr and Joe Giannuzzi. Their enthusiasm for the sport, and genuine concern for the great kids they worked with, was infectious. He coached hundreds of Holy Cross athletes from 1971-1978, many of whom went on to play college basketball, but more importantly, learned lessons that helped them become successful in their chosen careers. He put his college degrees to good use, teaching classes in American History, Accounting, Economics, Business Analysis, Introduction to Personal Finance and Introduction to Occupations. Although he officially retired in 2008 after 40 years, Rick continued to assist at the annual Golf Classic – raising monies for the Alumni Scholarship Fund - and developing lifelong friendships with classmates Frank Orzo and Art Louise.

His favorite time at Holy Cross spanned the seven years when his two sons, Ricky '92 and Garrhett '95, were enrolled. From a parent's perspective, Rick remarks, "They got a great foundation in their classroom and on the athletic fields, each playing two sports, and

becoming members of the National Honor Society (Rick was moderator for 10 years). It was through their eyes that I really saw the impact and true value of a Holy Cross education. The Brothers of Holy Cross were instrumental in shaping so many of my values and ideology as a student, teacher, and father to my sons and daughter."

He is proud of his children, and the life they have carved out for themselves. After attending Notre Dame, Ricky entered the financial industry, and is currently with Fort Washington Investment Advisors; Garrhett attended Kings College, and serves as Assistant Principal in Valley Stream; his daughter, Becky, attended the University of Dayton, and, when time

allows, is a substitute teacher in Bel Air, Maryland. It is evident that Rick had a significant influence on their chosen college and career paths. Between them, they have blessed Rick with seven grandchildren.



At a very difficult time for Rick in 2005, he was fortunate to meet Patty Sullivan, the woman who would become his wife in 2008. Patty's three children, and three grandchildren, melded with the Schneider brood, and together they create many unforgettable memories. The families visit often, either at their home in Naples, Florida, or at their summer residence in Jamesport, Long Island. Rick and Patty enjoy their life as Florida residents, and retirement is everything – and more – that he could ever have hoped it would be.

Rick gets together on occasion with his fellow faculty members from Holy Cross, and is in frequent contact with many of his former players, like Scott Masterson '73, who was delighted to hear about Rick's induction. "It was my

rare good fortune during my years as a student at Holy Cross to have as my mentors Gianuzzi, Kerr, O'Meara, Ellis and Schneider. But I count myself doubly lucky with the last of these, as Rick Schneider has remained a close friend. We often discuss the old days, and that's great fun—but just as pleasing to me is the fact that we're also making our way into the future together. And I am happy to be able to report (to any of you who may have lost touch with him) that Rick is every bit as sharp, funny, high-spirited, and wise as he was back when I'd just gotten my driver's license and Nixon was still in the White House. Congratulations to Rick on his induction into the Holy Cross Hall of Fame."


amon Tubridy was the youngest of three children born to Margaret ("Peggy") and Thomas Tubridy, both of whom emigrated from Ireland to the United States in their 20s. They settled in New Rochelle, New York, and moved to Hollis, Queens, shortly after Eamon's arrival. While Tom was employed as a load control tech by TWA, Peggy continued the nursing career she began in London, while raising Eamon and his siblings, Pauline and Joseph. When it came time for grammar school, there was never a doubt that the Tubridy children would receive a Catholic education. They all commuted the short distance to attend their parish school, Incarnation, in Queens Village.

In 1981, Eamon entered Holy Cross High School where he pursued his love of basketball under the direction of Coaches Jim Malone and Jim Kerr. Eamon proved a capable leader of the Freshmen, Junior Varsity and Varsity squads, and was named Most Valuable Player when he led the Knights to championship of the Long Island Lutheran Christmas Tournament. [In 2005, Eamon was named to the 1980's All Decade Team as part of the school's

Top 50 Players of all time.] Eamon's wife, Kathleen, recalls attending those games at Holy Cross as a teenager to watch her brother, Gerard Roche '82, play for the Knights. "There were always so many familiar faces at the games, since many of Eamon's neighborhood friends played in one league or another with him."

It was these friendships that grounded Eamon, even after he was recruited by several schools and accepted a scholarship from New York University. "We all gathered at JP OD's by St. John's, or at BB Jr's," Kathleen remarks. She and Eamon began their courtship around that time and were wed in Incarnation Church. They initially settled in Whitestone, and moved to Stewart Manor shortly after their oldest son, Tommy, was born in 1997. In relatively short

order, Tommy was joined by brother Eamon and sister Katie, in 1999 and 2000, respectively; eight years later God blessed them with their second daughter, Bridget.





On the home front, CYO Basketball provided Eamon an outlet to continue his passion for the sport. Both he and Doug Hayden '81 coached their

son's basketball teams in the same league, and the competition on the court was fierce. "You could hear Doug and Eamon shouting throughout the whole game," Kathleen recalls. All the while, Eamon stayed close to his alma mater, participating in the 3-on-3 basketball tournament fundraiser every few years, and becoming an SSP sponsor to Ricardo Chamorro '12, a Holy Cross student who lived in Corona. "He just loved Holy Cross so much," Kathleen says.

The Tubridy family purchased a summer home in Mattituck, and enjoyed spending time together on the East End of Long Island with their friends. Eamon and Kathleen took turns jockeying their children from one game or tournament to another, and the family grew and thrived.

In August of 2010, the Tubridy family was unprepared to receive heartbreaking news. Eamon was diagnosed with a brain tumor, and had to immediately undergo surgery to remove it. Despite a year of chemo, radiation and participation in a clinical trial at Massachusetts General, his aggressive form of brain cancer returned a year later. "We

were hopeful that he had beat it," Kathleen says. "He was back at work full-time, and 2010-2011 was a good year. Eamon was doing

fantastic." On December 12, 2011, Eamon passed away at the age of 44, his good friend, Steve Giammona '86, by his side. "Eamon had such a big impact on me and my family's life. We met at Holy Cross and shared so many great memories of young guys having fun. It evolved into raising families next door to each other in Stewart Manor, a true blessing that ended too soon," Steve says.

Eamon's children are his legacy, and they are thriving. Tommy, 24, graduated Fordham University; Eamon, 22, graduated from the College of the Holy Cross; Katie is a senior at Scranton; and Bridget just celebrated her 13th birthday. Eamon's friends continue to rally around and provide emotional support for the Tubridy family. In 2013, they established the Eamon Tubridy Scholarship Fund at Holy Cross High School in his memory

Reflecting on Eamon's induction, Steve expressed a sentiment shared by many. "Eamon was always a humble and generous person, with a deep faith. The fact that he was such a generous contributor through the SSP program – without the people closest to him even knowing – shows the quality of the person that he was. The Holy Cross Hall of Fame just got better."







GLENN F. XAVIER, MSW '91

Hamden Public Schools, Connecticut

"The Holy Cross brothers taught me -Be a good man, and life will be good to you."



n 1965, George Xavier set out from Port-Au-Prince, Haiti to the United States to escape poverty and political unrest, and to seek out a better life for his family. After securing employment, Rita joined George in Brooklyn, NY, along with their two daughters Arielle and Katia. Glenn Xavier was born in 1973, and the family moved to nearby Hollis, Queens, when he was three.

Devout Catholics, George and Rita were intent on ensuring that their children received a Catholic education. They applied all of their earnings towards tuition; however, when George suffered a disabling stroke in his early 50's (when Glenn was 12), he took a job as a bag boy at the local market. The owners recognized his tenacious work effort and soon promoted him to cashier. Glenn supplemented that income with a job cleaning classrooms at his school, and ushering for his church on Sundays.



Glenn attended an open house at Holy Cross and knew immediately that he belonged there. As a first generation student-athlete, Glenn applied himself under the tutelage and direction of football coach Stan Aufieri and was an All-City selection junior year. "Coach Aufieri not only taught me the game, he taught me how to become

a man," Glenn recalls fondly. Off the field, Glenn was an honor student and, due to his popularity and leadership skills, was elected Class President.

That year, Brother James Branigan encouraged Glenn to join the track team to build his speed for football. Head coach, Marty Brown, convinced him to compete. He ran in the Penn Relays junior year, when a crucial mistake on his part cost the team a medal. He vowed to make that up and, in his senior year as Captain of the team, he competed in the 400 meters.

He went on to win the 200 meters in the Brooklyn-Queens championships, and placed 2nd in the long jump. He placed 1st in the long jump at the regional Empire State Games and represented New York City in Syracuse. Glenn was selected MVP for his track team, and was an All-City selection. Over on the gridiron, during a critical recruiting season, Glenn sat out his first five games due to an injury. Despite this, and with the support and encouragement of Coach Tom Pugh, he finished the

season an All-City selection, and earned a football scholarship at Southern Connecticut State University. Outside the classroom, Glenn developed a passion for helping those in need when he interned at his grammar school, Incarnation. This became a recurring theme throughout his career and earned him the Holy Cross Service Award.

At SCSU, Glenn was a four-year starter in football, and ran track and field freshman year. He proved to be a valuable leader on and off the field. Working his way up to Director of the fitness center on campus, he was instrumental in developing a number of successful programs for students seeking to lose weight and hone their fitness skills. To better prepare them, he became a certified personal trainer at the local gym.

Upon graduating SCSU, Glenn became a childcare worker at Lake Grove, a placement for foster care and children with mental health and behavioral issues. The experience greatly impacted Glenn, and drove him to further his education, obtaining a master's degree in Social Work. Subsequently, he obtained



positions with The Children's Center, and Connecticut Children and Family Center, as a therapist and director. During this tenure, Glenn provided families with various program and support options, and even taught computer skills to the elderly. He was a sought after trainer at the JCC of New Haven, and led a group to win the "Largest Loser" competition at the community center.

Brother James Branigan introduced Glenn to the "Shepherds" program, where he became a mentor to Connecticut's inner city high school students. Recognizing the need to provide mental health support to students of color at Notre Dame High School in West Haven, CT, where he was President, Brother James offered Glenn a job as a school social worker. He graciously accepted, and served Notre Dame for 14 years in that role, and as Dean of Students. Glenn was best known for pioneering the "Grief Group" at NDHS, designed for students who had lost a sibling or parent.

Glenn continued to coach throughout his years at NDHS. He was an assistant coach for the 2019 Football State Champions and, as a head Track Coach, won the Southern Connecticut Conference East Championship. Many of his student athletes went on to play both football and track in college,

and Glenn ran a Fitness Bootcamp for their parents. He served on the Board of Directors of "Achievers," an athletic program for children with Downs Syndrome, and "Hospice St. Joseph," an organization providing educational and medical support to the people of Haiti. Glenn currently sits on the Board of Directors of "Shepherds," where he began as a mentor.

Glenn is currently working for the Hamden Public Schools as a social worker, and provides counseling to students at Post University in Waterbury, CT. He and his wife of 13 wonderful years, Jenny, a high school teacher, are now focused on raising their children: Berenger, 11; and twins, Evans and Brie, 6. Glenn applies his tenacious coaching style to their various sports and plans to return to private practice and professional coaching in the near future.

Glenn is appreciative of the opportunities that have been provided to him. He contributes his life success to the coaches and staff at Holy Cross High School. "The Holy Cross brothers have taught me – Be a good man and life will be good to you."







FDNY CHIEF CHARLES LAMBERTA '78

"I was surprised at how prepared I was for college because of what I learned at Holy Gross."



hen you meet FDNY Battalion Chief Charles Lamberta, you could easily overlook his accomplishments as a highly regarded member of New York's Bravest. He is unassuming in his demeanor and, even as he speaks of the tragedies he has seen unfurl over the course of the last 35 years, it is with that emotional detachment a leader must assume in order to take, and maintain, command.

Although the Lamberta family resided in Queens, Charlie was born in Wycoff Heights Hospital in Brooklyn, near the Engine Company where his dad, Alfred, was stationed. "The story goes that mom called the firehouse to tell him she was on the way to the hospital. Dad replied that he would be unable to leave work. However, when she arrived at the hospital Alfred was there waiting for her. Furthermore, she didn't want to check in until after midnight so she wouldn't be charged for the extra day," Charlie says.

Eileen Lamberta was a stay-at-home-mom who was there to greet Charlie and his sister, Laura, after school at Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament. In October of 1973, the family was completely unprepared for the heartbreak that befell them when, shortly after Charlie's 13th birthday, his dad suffered a heart aneurism, and passed away at the age of 53.

Charlie had the emotional support of his friends in the close-knit neighborhood of Bayside. Most of them were from Holy Cross families – Tollefsen, Burrows and Owens. It is not surprising, then, that he followed in their footsteps when it came time to choose a high school. At Holy Cross, Charlie was Manager of the Freshman and JV Basketball teams when they won the City Championships in 1975 and 1976. He counts Coaches Rick

Schneider, Jim Kerr and Bill O'Meara among the individuals who made a lasting impression on him.

After graduation, Charlie enrolled at Marist College, where he majored in Business Administration. He admits he was surprised at how prepared he was for college because of what he learned at Holy Cross. "I thought it would be much harder," he confides. A couple of his buddies from Holy Cross, Mike McCarthy and Tom Rooney – who became lifelong friends – made campus life that much more enjoyable. Marist was also where he met his future wife, Marilyn, when they both resided on the second floor of the dorm.

Charlie joined the NYPD when he graduated college in 1982, while he waited to be called by the Fire Department. Although he holds four citations for exemplary service, and was

active during the World Trade Center bombing in 1993, it was the events of 9/11, and the days that followed, that will always be ingrained in his memory. On September 6th, Charlie was promoted to Captain, but had not yet been assigned a company.

When the planes hit the World Trade Center, everyone in the FDNY was issued a recall, and Charlie took a bus from Shea Stadium to Ground Zero, where he spent the next two weeks in search, rescue and recovery operations. Just two months later, he was at a Rockaway Firehouse when Flight 587 crashed in Belle Harbor, shortly after takeoff. "I was working in the second due Engine Company. When we pulled out of the firehouse, we saw the smoke. En route, the dispatcher said this might be a plane crash. When we arrived, the street was literally on fire. We had to extinguish a block of fire just to get to the crash site," he recollects. All 260 people on board were killed, along with 5 people on the ground.

Charlie retired from the FDNY in 2019, thankful that his college background made him eligible for promotion to Battalion Chief. He and Marilyn

are empty nesters, but proud of the direction their children's lives have taken. Brian, 27, attended Townsend Harris, then Hunter's Macaulay Honors College, on scholarship. He lives nearby in Astoria and works for the DEP. 






"FOOD FOR THE FEARLESS"

was the early stages of the pandemic, when restaurants and stores were shuttered, people were told to shelter in place, but hospitals were overflowing with patients in the throes of a deadly virus that hit hard and fast. As temporary triage outposts and morgues were set up to accommodate the influx of patients and deceased, frontline first responders were stretched to their limits. Hospital staff, from Physicians and Nurses to transporters, police officers, fire fighters and EMS workers across the City and Long Island truly became the "fearless," representing the best of humanity. They treated critically ill patients as they struggled with the system's response to a situation that had no precedent, nor end in sight. These men and women filled the roles of loved




ones who were unable to visit and provide comfort and solace as they awaited word that become more ominous as the number of cases escalated. They worked round-the-clock, applying practices that changed as often as guidelines were updated, short on personal protective equipment, and fearful of going home and infecting their own families. These first responders were critical in the fight against a virus that brought the whole country to its knees. They were the face of the pandemic.

Early on in the pandemic, Mark Boccia, Jr. '12, felt a calling to do something to help. He was studying to be a Physician Assistant, and had been doing clinical rotations in hospitals to gain real-world experiences working in teams and honing the skills and knowledge he learned in the classroom. However, since he was not yet licensed, he was unable to help out in the trenches when classes were suspended. The exponential nature of the crisis became clear. "The things they were going through in the hospitals were absolutely

insane," he recalls, and he wanted to do something to help all the people who dedicated their time to educating him. "As the COVID-19 crisis unfolded, it became more and more clear to me that I was in a position to

provide support to our healthcare professionals at a time that they needed it the most," he says. Mark approached his dad, Mark Boccia, Sr., a partner in three restaurants in Queens; Bourbon Street, One Station Plaza and Austin's Ale House. He proposed using their kitchens and staff to prepare and deliver free meals for healthcare workers. "When Mark came to me on this, it was so right up our alley," says Mark Boccia, Sr. "It's always been a mainstay of our life, helping out the community."




and gratitude. The initial goal was to raise \$50,000, and for every \$1,000 raised, provide up to one hundred meals, with a minimum of two deliveries per week.



As news spread, "Food for the Fearless" not only surpassed their goal, but ultimately raised over \$100,000, enabling them to continue the initiative for as long as the monetary support allowed. They were humbled by the donations from loyal customers, family, friends, and even strangers who heard about the project. "I was so proud of my son for coming up with this initiative. It brought a lot of joy and happiness during such a bad time," Mark, Sr. says. "It didn't matter if we raised \$500 or \$500,000, we were focused on making the first responders' days just a little bit better, and at the same time employ some of our displaced staff to prepare and deliver the meals."

The beneficiaries of these meals included not only hospital units, but EMS workers, teachers, firehouses and precincts across NYC and Nassau. They fulfilled over 104 requests received by email, through the restaurant website, and the GoFundMe page. Mark's partners Peter Segrave '81 and Steven Baronoski '96 helped deliver the meals in person. "It was important that we meet the hospital staff and first responders to let them know we were behind them, and there for them," Peter says. William Brady, FDNY Engine 46 and Holy Cross graduate, Class of 2009, had some kind words to share about "Food for the Fearless." "Bourbon Street of Bayside has always been a family and community run establishment.

When the going got tough for the city of New York during the COVID-19 pandemic, they really stepped up to the plate and expanded that sense of community city-wide with "Food for the Fearless." I think I speak for every first

FATHER JIM FENSTERMAKER, C.S.C. '74



Pastor, Holy Cross Parish South Bend, Indiana

"It was God's plan that Tattended Holy Cross."



lthough in retrospect Father Jim Fenstermaker realized it was God's plan that he attended Holy Cross High School where he discovered the Congregation of Holy Cross Brothers and Priests, it was not until he took a three-year hiatus from religious formation that he was confident he had made the right choice. "During that time, God called on me twice, and I said, 'no'; the third time, I said 'yes'," he shares. And over the course of the last 38 years, Jim has zealously served to make God known, loved and served as pastor, teacher, administrator, vocation director, campus minister, and dorm chaplain, bringing the hope of the Cross – Ave Crux, Spes Unica – to schools, universities, parishes, and other ministries, across the globe.

Jim was born in Greenpoint, Brooklyn, the only son of Don and Agnes Fenstermaker, who relocated the family to New Hyde Park, New York, when he was a toddler. Jim and his three younger sisters, Susan, Ann and Joan attended Notre Dame School where Jim participated in track, handball and other street sports popular on Long Island. The family religiously attended services at Notre Dame Parish, where Jim was an altar server and sang in the Boys Choir. "When track wasn't in season, I also took accordion lessons, the choice of instrument in deference to my parents' Polish and German ancestries." He became an accomplished runner, and when it came time to choose a high school, his coach encouraged him to take a look at the track program at Holy Cross. "At first I wanted to go to another high school where my friends were going, but the draw to the track program at Holy Cross was too strong to pass up," he says.





At Holy Cross, Jim participated in cross country, indoor and outdoor track, a three season sport that left little time for other activities, especially since he had a lengthy

commute via public transportation after track practices. In his sophomore year, he attained his personal best in breaking the five-minute mile, and was in peak form at a sports camp at the Brother's retreat center in Valatie that following summer. Although Jim had taken an interest in religious life, as witnessed by the brothers at Holy Cross who dedicated themselves to life in community and service to the Church, it was in Valatie and later, during the Shelter Island Retreat junior year, that he seriously began to consider a vocation to the priesthood. "It was the first time I personally felt the presence of God in my life in such a significant way," he says. Perhaps it was providence that Jim sustained a major injury after the sports camp that precluded him from running track in his junior year. Instead, he opted to take the advanced courses necessary to begin his formation for the Congregation at Stonehill College

in Easton, Massachusetts, after his junior year. "My only regret was not being able to spend senior year with my classmates, when I had my license and would have been able to drive myself to events and participate in activities that tend to cement lifelong bonds."

In his third year of the candidate program for men considering religious life at Stonehill, Jim began questioning if religious life was truly his destiny. He decided to withdraw from the program and pursue a different avenue of study that enabled him to take a teaching and coaching position at Cardinal Spellman High School in Massachusetts. During that time, he attended Boston College where he began studies for a Masters in Theology before making the conscious decision to re-enter the Congregation in 1979. After his novitiate year of formation in the religious life of the Congregation, Jim made his first profession of vows as a religious in 1980. While in seminary, Jim pursued his Master of Divinity at Notre Dame, and was ordained a priest in 1984.

Jim was assigned to St. Stephen Parish in South Bend, as Associate Pastor, as well as Youth Minister at La Casa de Amistad Youth Center. He subsequently served at Most Holy Trinity Parish in Maine, and in his first pastorate at Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish, Brooklyn, before becoming Director of Vocations for the Congregation of Holy Cross, as well as a Resident Priest on the Stonehill campus, and eventually the Director of Campus Ministry.



He finished his service in Easton as Pastor of Holy Cross Parish, before taking on that role at Holy Cross Parish in South Bend, Indiana, in 2018, where he also oversees a growing elementary school and is involved in various diocesan, community and Congregational activities.

As he contemplates what the future may hold, Jim only knows for certain that he has many more years of full time ministry ahead of him. He is often reminded of the Brothers at Holy Cross, in particular, his track coach, Brother James Kane, C.S.C., and Brother Elmo Bransby, C.S.C., whose examples of the religious life opened his mind to discover and respond to God's will.
