






10 Things You Probably Didn't Know About Holy Cross's New President by: Samantha Sambucharan '23



This drive connects with the Holy Cross values of community and service as it helps to enforce the standards that we face within this school. According to the American Red Cross, every 2 seconds, a person in America requires a blood transfusion. By donating blood, you are helping people in need and saving lives at the same time. If you weren't able to donate this drive, there is another opportunity being held this spring on April 3rd. Keep in mind that just one blood donation can save up to three lives!
